ABOUT KANIDOLOKEE *(what performers want to know)*

1. How soon after I register can I start to sing?
 - You can start right away but your fans will not be able to enter their score online until we have processed your application, created your profile and your name appears in the contestant section which when registering online may take upto 3 days and by mail upto 10 days.
2. What is the NECK PASS that comes with my welcome kit for?
 - It allows you to by-pass the line and any cover charge at participating karaoke bars and lets the staff know that you are part of a group that has PRIORITY ACCESS to the karaoke machine ahead of non registered customers. It also comes with your exclusive I.D. number for quicker access to your file should you ever need to contact us.
3. How should I start my session when I get on stage to perform?
 - Ideally, you would introduce yourself to the crowd by telling them your name (pronounce clearly) as it appears on the website and ask the fans to write down your name on their FAN RATING CARD. The fans should then be reminded to bring their rating card home when they leave so they can enter their scores on the website.
4. How will I know if I made it to the Grand Finale in November?
 - The competition runs weekly at all participating bars and runs until the end of the quarter finales, expected to take place on November 25th. Each time you sing AND get someone to enter their score online, your “score average” will automatically adjust to reflect that latest entry. If you have the highest score of all the performers from THAT SPECIFIC BAR, you will need to come to Toronto for the Quarter Finales. To increase your chances, you should perform at the same bar, if possible.
5. Can I sing more than once during the course of the competition?
 - YES. Keep in mind that if you perform and scores entered online by the fans that night are lower than your previous performance, it will bring down your average. TIP: Only sing when you feel in great shape and know that you can equal or surpass your previous performance.
